Dates from tombstones at New Home Baptist Church Cem., Marl, Alabama. Grandson Dewey Harvey Owens, son of John Walton Owens, thought his grandfather's middle name might be Hamilton, but wasn't sure. ('Hampton' came from Rebecca Newsom Dobson book - not verified.) In 1860, he had 2 middle initials, both H's.

It is not known exactly when John H Owens moved to Holmes County, Florida, or how long he stayed. He was enumerated there on the Florida State Census of 1885, and all three of his sons, James H (6) John W (3) and William J (1) were listed as born in Alabama. The 1900 census lists all his children as born in Alabama, even Oscar, who it says was born in Oct 1885. The 1910 census says John W was born in Florida. So at least one or more of his children could have been born in Florida.

Four of his sons married 4 daughters of John D Weeks.

Dewey also said that Bill Owens was first married to DELLA WEEKS, sister to Dewey's mother LouVeny. Bill and Della had a son, Lee, who is buried at Piney Grove, and a daughter Lucille who married Fred Pettis and lives in Haines City, Fla. (Fred is dead now (1985)). He said that Lucille knows all about the family history. She works in an orange juice plant.

Phone conversation with Dewey 17 Sep 1988: Called him again to clarify which Bill Owens was married to Della Weeks. He said he thought it was his grandfather John Owen's brother's boy, who also had a son named Dewey. (Their mail used to get mixed up.) This sounds like Uncle Bill Owens who married Ida Rials. Dewey again mentioned Bill and Della's children Lee and Lucille Pettis (see Alto Lee Owens cemetery entry below). (I called Haines City, but found no Lucille Pettis.) But William H Owens and wife Della signed a deed to Dan Owens on 1 Feb 1904 and 18 Oct 1907. The William Owens who is Uncle Bill married Ida Rials 8 Apr 1906. Unless Uncle Bill was a bigamist, these 2 William H Owenses can't be the same person. (Note added later: What if Bill and Della were divorced and she had to sign deed to make it legal? 1910 census shows Bill as a second marriage to wife Ida.)

Dewey told me the story of what happened to John H's first wife, Mary. She was accidentally shot (in 1901) by a drunken Negro who was trying to shoot one of the McDuffie boys with whom he had been having some kind of argument. He shot into a group of people and the bullet hit Mary in the heart. She was about 44 and had 10 children aged 5 to 23. (Son James was married 10 days after his mother's death.) Dewey's father (John W) went to the hanging. Dewey thought this was the last Negro hanged around Geneva. Dewey said that his family always said the Owenses came from Ireland.
