Samuel Mosser and **Daniel Powell** together bought land for \$480 from Micajah Griffin on 22 Dec 1855 in T10 R21 of Pike County. On 31 Jan 1857, **Daniel Powell** and wife Sarah sold their half of that land to Samuel Mosser for \$200.

The George C Powell in Decatur Co, Ga, 1830 had 1 female <5 and 1 female 5-10, Eliza's age.
