On this 29th day of September, AD one thousand eight hundred and seventy nine, personally appeared before me, Clerk of the circuit court, the same being a court of record within and for the County and State aforesaid, (1) Mary Elizabeth Powell, age 90 years, resident of Dale county, in the state of Alabama, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that she is the widow of (2) Jacob C. Powell, deceased, who was the identical (3) Jacob C. Powell, who served under the name of (4) Jacob C. Powell as a (5) private in the company commanded by Captain Marsh (I think) of South Carolina Militia in the War of 1812; that her said husband enlisted at Edgefield, SC on or about the 1st day of March AD 1812 for the term of six months, and continued in actual service in said war for the term of 53 days and whose service terminated by reason of honorable discharge at new Savannah, GA on the 27th of april AD 1813. She furthur states

that the following is a full description of her said husband at the time of his enlistment, vz: about 25 years old, ______ complexion, blue eyes, rather dark hair, and she further declares that she has heretofore made an application for bounty, land and received a warrant for 120 acres in 1855 and transferred same to Wm. McCall and that her resience is of Dale Co., AL. signed Mary Elizabeth Powell

Also, personally appeared William Powell, aged 85 years, resideing in Dale Co., AL and James M. Bridges, aged 70, residing in Dale Co., AL, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly sworn, say that they have known the said Mary Elizabeth Powellfor 75 years and for 41 years, respectively; that they were present and saw her sign her name (or make her mark) to the foregoing declaration; that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of said claimant and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be; and they further say that they are able to identify her as the person who was the wife of the identical Jacob C. Powell who rendered the service alleged in the above application (in the company of Captain Marsh, in the regiment of the SC Militia in the war of 1812) by the following named facts and circumstances, viz: from personal knowledge of the marriage by witness Powell, and from being neighbors and seeing them live together as husband and wife by witness Bridges and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
