No Known Descendants

Generation No. 1

1. NORTH GANO¹ POWELL¹ was born Abt. 1827 in South Carolina², and died Bef. Dec 1865. He married ELIZABETH BARRON³ 02 Feb 1860 in Pike County, Alabama^{4,5}. She was born Abt. 1839 in Alabama⁶.

Notes for NORTH GANO POWELL:

North Gano Powell attested to the ages of Tinsey Powell (over 18) and Nathan W Grantham (over 21) at their marriage on 21 Dec 1848. He is possibly another son of **George C** and Orphie Starling Powell of Troy. Was Tinsey Powell his sister? Or could he be a brother of **Abraham C**, whose father is unidentified? His family was not found in 1850, either.

These three boys were in the household of George C Powell in 1860. Could they be sons of North Gano Powell before he married Elizabeth Barron in Feb 1860? Their father is reported to be Gaines Powell - very close to Gano (Ganos? Gaines?). The Joneses moved to Santa Rosa County and lived near Sweet and Abraham C Powell. Gano is close to Gaines and he had some connection to George C, but Gano was about 7 years younger than reported (c1820) for Eliza Jones. She would have been about 30 when the oldest boy, Isaac, was born c1850-52. That is rather late to start having children, so maybe her birth year is not absolutely accurate.

Note: **Irvin Griffin**, who married **Eliza C Powell** in 1844, may be his brother-in-law. Not proven, but Eliza appears likely to be a dau of George C and Orphie Powell, but she could be daughter of William on 1840 Pike census.

NG's quartersection was snugged up into a corner surrounded on 2 sides by George C Powell's land. In 1852, Abram C acquired 40 ac only one quartersection NW of North Gano, which Abraham then sold to him. George C Powell had at least 320 acres in Section 21 10N 21E (1839-58) plus 40 ac in Sec 9 (1837) which touched corners with a parcel owned by Daniel Powell. Stephen P had 80 ac in Sec 9 10N 21E adj Daniel. Richard (& Charlotte) had patents for 160 ac in Sec 28 10N 21E, 80 ac.

21 Oct 1852: Richard and Charlott Powell to North G Powell for \$50. SW ¼ of NW ¼ S21 T10 R21.
Wit: S W Powell and G C Powell.
20 Nov 1852: Richard Powell and wife Charlotta to Sweet Powell in T10 R21. Wit: G C Powell and N G Powell.

Notes for ELIZABETH BARRON:

See Griffin family article by Larry Duncan on pg 360? of **Heritage of Pike County**, which says that William Griffin (b. 1794 in Columbus Co, NC) and Nancy Jones (b. 1790) had sons Irvin, who married Eliza Caroline Powell, and Joseph (1829-1902), who married Elizabeth Barron Powell. The Joneses, Griffins and Powells were apparently closely connected for several generations. (Sweet Powell married Susan Jones.) See notes on George C Powell and North G Powell about Jones boys in household of George C Powell in 1850.
