Information regarding the descendants of Davis Washington Austin came from Robert E. Austin, Buz Glass and Cindy Porter Mulligan who are descendants of this line.

#### From Bob Austin:

According to his son, Conrad, Davis Washington Austin lived in Pensacola and worked at the Naval Yard at the outbreak of the Civil War. He evidently worked there building ships. When the war began he organized a company of soldiers to join the fight, with himself as captain. Unfortunately for him (or perhaps very fortunately), the people making the decisions decided he was too valuable to the Southern cause as a ship builder and he was detailed to the Naval Yard building ships for the South. After the war he returned to Butler County.

[personal note: The 1870 census I checked showed a Washington Austin, age 45, occupation house carpenter, living in Escambia County (on the Alabama-Florida line) with John, age 21] According to Conrad, Davis moved to Birmingham in 1871 and remained there until his death in 1902 [note: Conrad had his father's date of death wrong] at the age of 76. He was a contractor and builder, the Jefferson County Coroner, a deputy sheriff, the jailer and in his later years engaged in real estate.

After the war, about 1871, he moved to Birmingham. There he worked as a constable, deputy sheriff and jailer. Children include:
